11	1 Section 1. Section 33-2-301, MCA, is amended to	read:	
12	"33-2-301. Short title purpose definitions. (1) This part constitutes and may be referred to as "The		
13	Surplus Lines Insurance Law".		
14	(2) The purpose of this part is to:		
15	(a) protect persons seeking insurance in this state;		
16	(b) permit surplus lines insurance to be placed with reputable and financially sound unauthorized insurers		
17	and to be exported from this state pursuant to this part;		
18	(c) establish a system of regulation that will permit orderly access to surplus lines insurance in this state		
19	and encourage authorized insurers to provide new and innovative types of insurance to consumers in this state;

21	(d) protect revenues of this state.

12 (H)(m) "Multistate risk" means a risk covered by an unauthorized insurer with insured exposures in more
 13 than one state.

(m)(n) "Natural disaster multiperil insurance" means any bundled flood, earthquake, and landslide
 insurance that may be sold as surplus lines insurance.

(n)(o) "Principal place of business" means the state where the insured business maintains its
 headquarters and where the insured's high-level officers direct, control, and coordinate the business activities
 of the insured.

(o)(p) "Principal residence" means the state where an individual insured resides for the greatest number
 of days during a calendar year or, if the insured's principal residence is located outside of any state, the state to
 which the greatest percentage of the insured's taxable premium for that insurance contract is located.

(p)(q) "Producing insurance producer" means a Montana-licensed property and casualty insurance
 producer dealing directly with a person seeking insurance.

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(q)(r) "Qualified risk manager" has the meaning provided in 33-2-319.

(r)(s) "Single-state risk" means a risk covered by an unauthorized insurer with exposures in only one
 state.

27 (s)(t) "State" means any state of the United States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto
 28 Rico, Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands, the Virgin Islands, and American Samoa.

(t)(u) (i) "Surplus lines insurance" means any property or casualty insurance permitted in a state to be
 placed directly or through a surplus lines insurance producer with an unauthorized insurer eligible to accept the

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1 insurance. The term includes independently procured insurance.

(ii) The term does not include the kinds of insurance exempted under 33-2-317.

3 (u)(v) "Surplus lines insurance producer" means an individual or business entity licensed under 33-2-305
4 to place surplus lines insurance on risks resident, located, or to be performed in this state with unauthorized
5 insurers eligible to accept the insurance.

6 (v)(w) "Unauthorized insurer" means, with respect to a state, an insurer not authorized to transact the
7 business of insurance in the state. The term includes an insurance exchange authorized under the laws of
8 another state. The term does not include a risk retention group, as that term is defined in the Liability Risk
9 Retention Act of 1986, 15 U.S.C. 3901(a)(4)."

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Section 2. Section 33-2-307, MCA, is amended to read:

12 "33-2-307. Requirements for eligible surplus lines insurers -- list of eligible surplus lines insurers.

(1) If an unauthorized insurer is domiciled in any state, a surplus lines insurance producer may not place
 insurance with that unauthorized insurer unless, at the time of placement, the unauthorized insurer:

(a) is authorized to issue the same kind of property or casualty insurance in its domiciliary jurisdiction;
 and

(b) maintains capital and surplus or its equivalent under the laws of its state of domicile, which equalsthe greater of:

19 (i) the minimum capital and surplus requirements of 33-2-109 and 33-2-110; or

(ii) \$15 million. An insurer possessing less than \$15 million capital and surplus may satisfy the
 requirements of this subsection upon an affirmative finding of acceptability by the commissioner. The
 commissioner's finding must be based upon such on factors as that include:

- 23 (A) the quality of management, capital, and surplus of a parent company;
- 24 (B) company underwriting profit and investment income trends;
- 25 (C) market availability; and
- 26 (D) company record and reputation within the industry.

27 (<u>2</u>) The commissioner may not make an affirmative finding of acceptability when the surplus lines 28 insurer's capital and surplus is less than \$4.5 million.

(2)(3) If an unauthorized insurer is an alien insurer, a surplus lines insurance producer may not place
 insurance with that unauthorized insurer unless, at the time of placement, the unauthorized insurer appears on

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1 the national association of insurance commissioners' Non-Admitted Insurers Quarterly Listing.

2 (3)(4) A list of eligible surplus lines insurers must be published at least semiannually by the 3 commissioner and must contain FOR a range of risks that are covered, including disability INCOME insurance as 4 defined in 33-2-301. This subsection does not require the commissioner to place or maintain the name of any 5 unauthorized insurer on the list of eligible surplus lines insurers. An action may not lie against the commissioner 6 or an employee of the commissioner for anything said in issuing the list of eligible surplus lines insurers referred 7 to in this subsection. 8 (4)(5) As used in this section, the following definitions apply: 9 (a) "Capital", as used in the financial requirements of this section, means funds invested in for stocks 10 or other evidences of ownership. 11 (b) "Surplus", as used in the financial requirements of this section, means funds over and above liabilities 12 and capital of the insurer for the protection of policyholders." 13 14 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 2019.
