10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
11	
12	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Legislative study of fiscal issues regarding education. (1) A committee
13	appointed pursuant to subsection (2) shall direct a study of the following topics related to education:
14	(a) K-12 special education funding;
15	(b) the community college funding formula; and
16	(c) career and training education credit values.
17	(2) The study must be conducted by a bipartisan committee consisting of the following:
18	(a) four members of the joint appropriations subcommittee on education, with two members from the
19	majority party and two members from the minority party, appointed by the presiding officer of the joint
20	appropriations subcommittee on education; and
21	(b) four members of the legislative finance committee, with two members from the majority party and two
22	members from the minority party, appointed by the presiding officer of the legislative finance committee.
23	(3) The committee shall hold four meetings to coincide with meetings held by the legislative finance
24	committee.

26	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Appropriation. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, there is
27	appropriated \$5,000 from the general fund to the legislative fiscal division for purposes of conducting the study
28	as set forth in [section 1].

30	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Contingent voidness. If [this act] is passed and approved and does not
