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9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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11	Section 1. Section 80-7-1004, MCA, is amended to read:
12	"80-7-1004. (Temporary) Invasive species account. (1) There is an invasive species account in the
13	state special revenue fund. The account <u>is subject to legislative transfer and</u> is administered by the department
14	of fish, wildlife, and parks.
15	(2) Money transferred from any lawful source, including but not limited to fees collected pursuant to
16	87-2-130, [15-72-601, and 15-72-602,] gifts, grants, donations, securities, or other assets, public or private, may
17	be deposited in the account.
18	(3) Subject to subsection (4), money deposited in the account must be used for projects that prevent or
19	control any nonnative, aquatic invasive species pursuant to this part.
20	(4) Any private contribution deposited in the account for a particular purpose, as stated by the donor,
21	must be used exclusively for that purpose.
22	(5) At the end of each fiscal year, unreserved funds in the account, including any interest and earnings,
23	must be transferred to the invasive species trust fund established in 80-7-1016.
24	(6) The department of fish, wildlife, and parks may not recover indirect costs from the invasive species
25	account. (Terminates February 29, 2020sec. 21(1), Ch. 387, L. 2017; bracketed language terminates June 30,
26	2019sec. 21(3), Ch. 387, L. 2017.)
27	80-7-1004. (Effective March 1, 2020) Invasive species account. (1) There is an invasive species
28	account in the state special revenue fund. The account is administered by the department of fish, wildlife, and
29	parks.
30	(2) Money transferred from any lawful source, including but not limited to gifts, grants, donations,

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- 1 securities, or other assets, public or private, may be deposited in the account.
- 2 (3) Subject to subsection (4), money deposited in the account must be used for projects that prevent or control any nonnative, aquatic invasive species pursuant to this part.
  - (4) Any private contribution deposited in the account for a particular purpose, as stated by the donor, must be used exclusively for that purpose.
  - (5) At the end of each fiscal year, unreserved funds in the account, including any interest and earnings, must be transferred to the invasive species trust fund established in 80-7-1016.
  - (6) The department of fish, wildlife, and parks may not recover indirect costs from the invasive species account. (Subsection (6) terminates June 30, 2027--sec. 21(2), Ch. 387, L. 2017.)"

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Fund transfer. By [15 days after the effective date of this act], the state treasurer shall transfer \$1,766,000 from the aquatic invasive species account established in 80-7-1004 to the good neighbor forestry state special revenue account established in 76-13-151.

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Effective date. [This act] is effective on passage and approval. 15

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
