11	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE JEANNETTE RANKIN MEMORIAL HIGHWAY
12	IN MISSOULA COUNTY; DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO INSTALL SIGNS AT
13	THE LOCATION AND TO INCLUDE THE MEMORIAL HIGHWAY ON THE NEXT PUBLICATION OF THE
14	STATE HIGHWAY MAP; PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE

17	WHEREAS, Jeannette Rankin was born near Missoula, Montana, on June 11, 1880. She grew up on a
18	ranch, which she helped to maintain, and enjoyed the outdoor Montana lifestyle many of us cherish; and
19	WHEREAS, Jeannette Rankin studied at the University of Montana, graduating in 1902 with a Bachelor
20	of Science degree in biology; and
21	WHEREAS, Jeannette Rankin worked as a social worker before becoming involved in the women's
22	suffrage movement; and
23	WHEREAS, Jeannette Rankin's advocacy work in Montana was instrumental in granting women the
24	unrestricted right to vote in Montana in 1914; and
25	WHEREAS, Jeannette Rankin was significant in initiating legislation that eventually became the 19th
26	Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, granting unrestricted voting rights to women; and
27	WHEREAS, Jeannette Rankin made history as the first woman to hold federal office in the United States
28	when she was elected to serve in the U.S. Congress; and
29	WHEREAS, Jeannette Rankin was elected to the U.S. Congress in 1916 and again in 1940; and
30	WHEREAS, Jeannette Rankin passed away in 1973 leaving a legacy of advocacy and freedom for future

2	WHEREAS, the 66th Legislature of the State of Montana honors Jeannette Rankin for her exemplary life
3	of service and leadership.

5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
6	
7	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Jeannette Rankin memorial highway. (1) There is established the
8	Jeannette Rankin memorial highway on existing interstate 90 from mile marker 101 to mile marker 106.
9	(2) The department shall design and install appropriate signs marking the location of the Jeannette
0	Rankin memorial highway.
1	(3) Maps that identify roadways in Montana must be updated to include the location of the Jeannette
2	Rankin memorial highway when the department updates and publishes the state maps.
3	
4	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated \$1 for the biennium beginning July
5	1, 2019, from the state general fund to the department of transportation for the purpose of [section 1].
6	
7	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an
8	integral part of Title 60, chapter 1, part 2, and the provisions of Title 60, chapter 1, part 2, apply to [section 1].
9	
20	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Effective date. [This act] is effective on passage and approval.
