5	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
6	MONTANA REQUESTING AN INTERIM LEGISLATIVE STUDY ON ACCESSIBILITY FOR ELECTORS WITH
7	DISABILITIES.

9	WHEREAS, the State Administration and Veterans' Affairs Interim Committee during the 2017-2018
10	interim learned about accessible voting technology for electors with disabilities and conducted a preliminary
11	review of related state statutes; and
12	WHEREAS, the preliminary review revealed that Montana statutes could be updated with respect to
13	federal law references and statutory language concerning accessible voting machines and technology; and
14	WHEREAS, the review also raised significant policy questions about how to improve accessibility for
15	electors with disabilities; and
16	WHEREAS, an interim study would allow for a systematic review of federal and state laws concerning
17	accessibility for electors with disabilities and a careful examination of related policy issues with the participation
18	of all interested stakeholder groups.

20	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
21	STATE OF MONTANA:
22	That the Legislative Council be requested to designate an appropriate interim committee, pursuant to
23	section 5-5-217, MCA, to:
24	(1) examine federal and state laws related to accessibility for electors with disabilities;
25	(2) solicit and consider comments, concerns, and suggestions from all interested stakeholder groups,
26	including BUT NOT LIMITED TO the elections staff in the Office of the Secretary of State, THE OFFICE OF PUBLIC
27	$\underline{\textbf{INSTRUCTION.}} \ \textbf{election administrators}, \ \textbf{counties}, \ \textbf{school districts}, \ \textbf{elderly electors}, \ \textbf{and electors with disabilities};$
28	(3) identify and analyze relevant policy and logistical issues and options; and
29	(4) if appropriate, develop a committee bill to update or revise related state laws based on the
30	committee's study findings and recommendations.

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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all aspects of the study be concluded prior to September 15, 2020.

2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the final results of the study, including any findings, conclusions,

3 comments, or recommendations of the appropriate committee, be reported to the 67th Legislature.
