4	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE A	AND THE HOUSE	OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF	
5	MONTANA PROVIDING FOR AN INTERIM STUDY OF BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN PATHS.

7	WHEREAS, residents and tourists are	e attracted to lifelor	g activities including bicycling and walking; and	
8	WHEREAS, a 2015 survey of Montana residents indicates that 46% of respondents bicycled in the			
9	previous year, 48% of bicycling was on paved paths, and only 13% of respondents felt "somewhat safe" or "very			
10	safe" when bicycling; and			
11	WHEREAS, bicyclists are utilizing a le	egal, valid, and reco	gnized mode of transportation and have defined	
12	responsibilities and considerations, including a higher need for protection and accommodating infrastructure; and			
13	WHEREAS, bicycle and pedestrian paths are often situated in the rights of way of county and municipa			
14	roadways maintained by the Montana Department of Transportation, and funding for maintenance of the paths			
15	lacks coordination and alignment; and			
16	WHEREAS, the State of Montana has instituted fee-for-use systems, including activities on Department			
17	of Natural Resources and Conservation lands, Fish, Wildlife, and Parks sites, state highways, and snowmobile			
18	trails for maintenance and construction of trails.

20	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE			
21	STATE OF MONTANA:			
22	That the Legislative Council be requested to designate an appropriate interim committee, pursuant to			
23	section 5-5-217, MCA, to study bicycle and pedestrian paths, including:			
24	(1) the purposes for which bicycle	e and pedestrian	paths are used, including but not limited to	
25	transportation, recreation, and tourism;			
26	(2) safety implications related to bicy	ycle and pedestriar	n paths;	
27	(3) economic impacts of bicycle and pedestrian paths;			
28	(4) current levels of funding for bicycle and pedestrian paths provided by the state and loca			
29	governments;			
30	(5) consideration of funding options;	; and		
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1	(6) how other states and adjacent provinces establish, fund, and manage bicycle and pedestrian paths.		
2	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all aspects of the study, including presentation and review		
3	requirements, be concluded prior to September 15, 2020.		
4	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the final results of the study, including any findings, conclusions,		
5	comments, or recommendations of the appropriate committee, be reported to the 67th Legislature.
