4 A RESOLUTION OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA EXPRESSING THE
5 SENTIMENT THAT THE GOVERNOR DESIGNATE SEXUAL ASSAULT SURVIVORS' DAY ON ~~NOVEMBER~~
6 6 THE FIRST THURSDAY IN APRIL OF EACH YEAR; AND REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE
7 OF MONTANA TO ISSUE A PROCLAMATION DECLARING ~~NOVEMBER 6~~ THE FIRST THURSDAY IN APRIL
8 OF EACH YEAR AS SEXUAL ASSAULT SURVIVORS' DAY.

10 WHEREAS, it is the sentiment of the House of Representatives that the purpose of Sexual Assault
11 Survivors' Day is to recognize and honor the courage of survivors, bring awareness to the issue of sexual assault,
12 and inform individuals on how they can stop sexual violence before it happens by promoting safety and respect;
13 and

14 WHEREAS, the goal of Sexual Assault Survivors' Day is to raise public awareness about victims of sexual
15 violence and educate communities on how to prevent it; and

16 WHEREAS, Sexual Assault Survivors' Day calls attention to the fact that sexual violence is widespread
17 and impacts every person in the state; and

18 WHEREAS, the crimes of sexual assault and rape not only ~~creates~~ CREATE victims but also secondary
19 victims who also survive levels of trauma, and Sexual Assault Survivors' Day would honor those who are left to
20 pick up the pieces alongside their loved ones; and

21 WHEREAS, rape, sexual assault, and sexual harassment harm our community and our state, and
22 statistics show one in five women and one in 67 men will be raped at some point in their lives; and

23 WHEREAS, child sexual abuse prevention must be a priority to confront the reality that one in six boys
24 and one in four girls will experience sexual assault before age 18; and

25 WHEREAS, on campus, one in five women and one in 16 men are sexually assaulted during their time
26 in college; and

27 WHEREAS, our words shape the world around us, and whether a person speaks out against
28 inappropriate talk or helps someone better understand these issues, a person's voice is powerful and necessary
29 in this conversation; and

30 WHEREAS, individuals can embrace their voices to show their support for survivors, stand up to victim

1 blaming, shut down rape jokes, correct harmful misconceptions, promote everyday consent, and practice healthy
2 communication with kids; and

3 WHEREAS, we join advocates and communities across the country in taking action to honor the courage
4 of survivors of sexual assault and prevent sexual violence, and each day of the year is an opportunity to create
5 change for the future.

7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
8 MONTANA:

9 That it is the sentiment of the members of this House of Representatives that the Governor recognize
10 ~~November 6~~ THE FIRST THURSDAY IN APRIL of each year as Sexual Assault Survivors' Day.

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the House of Representatives requests the Governor of the State of
12 Montana to designate ~~November 6~~ THE FIRST THURSDAY IN APRIL of each year as Sexual Assault Survivors' Day
13 and issue a proclamation recognizing that day and marking the day with appropriate ceremonies and activities.

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Clerk of the House deliver a copy of this resolution to the
15 Governor of the State of Montana.
