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10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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12	Section 1. Section 2-7-504, MCA, is amended to read:
13	"2-7-504. Accounting methods. (1) Unless otherwise required by law, the department shall prescribe
14	by rule the general methods and details of accounting for the receipt and disbursement of all money belonging
15	to local government entities and shall establish in those offices general methods and details of accounting. All
16	local government entity officers shall conform with the accounting standards prescribed by the department.
17	(2) The rules adopted by the department must be in accordance with:
18	(a) generally accepted accounting principles established by the governmental accounting standards
19	board or its generally recognized successor <u>; or</u>
20	(b) a financial reporting framework as defined by the department."
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22	Section 2. Section 7-6-609, MCA, is amended to read:
23	"7-6-609. Declaration of policy. (1) It is the policy of the state of Montana that all governmental
24	accounting systems be established and maintained in accordance with:
25	(a) generally accepted accounting principles that are nationally recognized as set forth by the
26	governmental accounting standards board or its generally recognized successor; or
27	(b) a financial reporting framework as defined by the department.
28	(2) The codifications, pronouncements, and interpretations of the governmental accounting standards
29	board or its generally recognized successor must be recognized as the primary authoritative reference for
30	governmental accounting."

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2	Section 3. Section 7-6-611, MCA, is amended to read:
3	"7-6-611. Role of department of administration. (1) The department of administration shall prescribe
4	for all local governments:
5	(a) general methods and details of accounting in accordance with generally accepted accounting
6	principles as provided in 2-7-504;
7	(b) uniform internal and interim reporting systems as part of the uniform reporting systems provided for
8	in 2-7-503;
9	(c) the form of the annual financial report as provided in 2-7-503; and
10	(d) general methods and details of accounting for the annual financial report as provided in 2-7-513.
11	(2) Local governments shall file with the department of administration:
12	(a) an annual financial report within 6 months of the fiscal yearend; and
13	(b) an audit report within 12 months of the end of the audited period.
14	(3) The governing body of each county or municipality shall notify the department of administration in
15	writing, on a form prescribed by the department of administration, of the creation, dissolution, combination, or
16	other legal alteration of any special purpose district within the county or municipality.
17	(4) Each special purpose district shall obtain a permanent mailing address and notify the department
18	of administration of the address and of any subsequent changes of the district's address."
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20	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 2019.
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22	NEW SECTION. Section 5. Applicability. [This act] applies to fiscal years beginning on or after July
23	1, 2019.



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
