23	(a) a variance will not result in a lowering of currently attained, ambient water quality;			
24	(b) the department rules are consistent, as necessary, with federal rules that authorize states to adopt			
25	variances from standards, including but not limited to 40 CFR 131.14; and

(3) The department shall review a temporary variance issued pursuant to this section at least once every 5 years and may continue, modify, or terminate the temporary variance as a result of the review.
