3	BY REQUEST OF THE STATE-TRIBAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE

5	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
6	MONTANA REQUESTING AN INTERIM STUDY OF OPTIONS TO BREAK THE CYCLE OF YOUTH WHO RUN
7	AWAY FROM HOME.
8	
9	WHEREAS, the Department of Justice reports that 68 Montana youth were reported missing three or
10	more times in 2017 with one youth reported missing 18 times in that year; and
11	WHEREAS, the Department of Justice reports that 543 Montana youth were reported missing three or
12	more times between 2013 and 2017 with one youth reported missing 26 times during that period; and
13	WHEREAS, 28% of the youth reported missing multiple times in 2017 were American Indian; and
14	WHEREAS, 22% of the youth reported missing multiple times in 2017 were in foster care some or all of
15	the times they were reported missing (19% were in state custody and 2% were in tribal custody); and
16	WHEREAS, the Department of Justice and the State-Tribal Relations Committee recommend developing
17	methods to intervene with youth who run away to determine why they ran away and assist with underlying
18	problems in order to break the runaway cycle, which drains school, law enforcement, youth court, and other
19	resources.
20	
21	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
22	STATE OF MONTANA:
23	That the Legislative Council be requested to designate an appropriate interim committee, pursuant to
24	section 5-5-217, MCA, to study the reasons why youth repeatedly run away, including any reasons related to
25	mental health, and the services or interventions, including wrap-around and community-based programs, that
26	could help to break that cycle.
27	BEITFURTHERRESOLVED, thatthecommitteeexaminetheeconomicimpactsofyouthwhorunaway,
28	including costs to schools, law enforcement, the judicial system, and the social services system.
29	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all aspects of the study, including presentation and review
30	requirements, be concluded prior to September 15, 2020.

- 4 on the seven Montana reservations and to the Little Shell Chippewa tribe.
