4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REVISING LAWS RELATED TO THE ISSUANCE OF ELK
5	HUNTING LICENSES USED ON PRIVATE LAND; ESTABLISHING A LANDOWNER-SPONSORED
6	NONRESIDENT ELK-ONLY COMBINATION LICENSE; PROVIDING AN ANTLERLESS ELK-ONLY OPTION
7	TO ALL HUNTERS WITH ADDITIONAL BONUS POINTS FOR THOSE WHO EXERCISE IT; AUTHORIZING A
8	DISCOUNTED PRICE FOR CERTAIN ANTLERLESS ELK B TAG LICENSES; AMENDING SECTION
9	<u>SECTIONS 87-1-325, 87-2-104, AND 87-2-117, MCA; AND PROVIDING A DELAYED EFFECTIVE DATE."</u>

11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

13	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Class B-13landowner-sponsored nonresident elk-only
14	combination license. (1) The department shall offer for sale, for the same fee established in 87-2-511(6),
15	Class B-13 landowner-sponsored nonresident elk-only combination licenses to persons otherwise qualified to
16	purchase a license pursuant to this part and who are sponsored by a qualifying landowner to hunt solely on that
17	landowner's deeded land or property in accordance with rules adopted by the commission for a general elk
18	license in the applicable hunting district.
19	(2) A landowner may sponsor up to 40-five license applicants pursuant to this section, if the
20	landowner owns calculated at one applicant per 640 or more contiguous acres owned by the landowner within a
21	hunting district where the sustainable population number for elk, as calculated pursuant to 87-1-323, is at
22	objective as determined by the department's most recent elk survey count. If the most recent elk survey count is
23	above or below the sustainable population number, a landowner does not qualify. To be eligible, a landowner
24	may not accept monetary consideration from the license applicant for the sponsorship or for providing any
25	services or assistance to the applicant except as provided in Title 37, chapter 47, and this title.
26	(3) Licenses issued pursuant to this section are in addition to nonresident elk-only combination
27	licenses available for sale pursuant to 87-2-511(6).
28	(4) A person who obtains a license pursuant to this section may not, in the same license year, obtain



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a nonresident elk-only combination license pursuant to 87-2-511(6) or a Class B-10 nonresident big game combination license.

- NEW SECTION. Section 2. Antierless elk-only option -- bonus points. (1) A person who obtains a Class A-5 elk tag or an equivalent nonresident elk tag may, at the time of issuance, indicate the person will only use the tag to hunt antierless elk between August 15 and February 15 on private land in hunting districts where the elk population is above the sustainable population number established pursuant to 87-1-323 as determined by the department's most recent elk survey count.
- (2) A person who exercises the option in subsection (1):
 - (a) may not apply for an elk permit by drawing within in the same license year;
 - (b) may not obtain a Class B-13 landowner-sponsored nonresident elk-only combination license pursuant to [section 1] in the same license year; and
 - (b)(c) may buy a single bonus point in the same license year pursuant to 87-2-117(2)(b) due to nonparticipation in a drawing and receive an additional five-elk species bonus points point for a total of six elk species bonus points each license year the person exercises the option in subsection (1). If the person later verifies as prescribed by the department that the person hunted on private property pursuant to subsection (1) the person must receive a third elk species bonus point for the license year.

- Section 3. Section 87-1-325, MCA, is amended to read:
- "87-1-325. Rulemaking -- discounted antlerless elk B tag licenses. (1) The department and the commission shall adjust existing wildlife management rules and plans to implement 87-1-321 through 87-1-325.
- (2) The department and the commission may adopt rules for determining sustainability. The commission shall consider average carrying capacity and use generally accepted animal unit factors for each species in each commission region.
- (3) Any rules adopted by the department pursuant to subsection (2) must be adopted in a timely manner.
- (4) The commission may offer for sale at one-half of the cost of a regularly priced license Class A-9 resident antlerless elk B tag licenses and Class B-12 nonresident antlerless elk B tag licenses to be used as



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1	prescribed by the commission on private lands in hunting districts where the elk population is above the
2	sustainable population number established pursuant to 87-1-323 as determined by the department's most
3	recent elk survey count."

Section 4. Section 87-2-104, MCA, is amended to read:

"87-2-104. Number of licenses, permits, or tags allowed -- fees. (1) The department may prescribe rules and regulations for the issuance or sale of a replacement license, permit, or tag if the original license, permit, or tag is lost, stolen, or destroyed upon payment of a fee not to exceed \$5.

- (2) When authorized by the commission for game management purposes, the department may:
- (a) issue more than one Class A-3 resident deer A, Class A-4 resident deer B, Class B-7 nonresident deer A, Class B-8 nonresident deer B, Class E-1 resident wolf, Class E-2 nonresident wolf, or special antelope license to an applicant;
- (b) issue a special antlerless moose license, a special cow or calf bison license, or one or more special adult ewe mountain sheep licenses to an applicant; and
- (c) issue one or more Class A-9 resident antlerless elk B tag licenses or Class B-12 nonresident antlerless elk B tag licenses to an applicant. Unless otherwise reduced pursuant to 87-1-325 or subsection (4) of this section, the fee for a Class B-12 license is \$270.
- (3) For all of the game management licenses issued under subsection (2), the commission shall determine the hunting districts or portions of hunting districts for which the licenses are to be issued, the number of licenses to be issued, and all terms and conditions for the use of the licenses.
- (4) The fee for a resident or nonresident license of any class issued under subsection (2) may be reduced annually by the department."

- **Section 5.** Section 87-2-117, MCA, is amended to read:
- "87-2-117. License bonus point system. (1) The commission shall establish a bonus point system that gives an applicant who has purchased more bonus points more chances in a drawing to receive a license, tag, or permit over an applicant who has purchased fewer bonus points.
 - (2) A Subject to the provisions of [section 2], a person may purchase only one bonus point per

- 2 (a) purchase a bonus point when applying for a license, tag, or permit by paying the fee established in 87-2-113(2) per species; or
 - (b) purchase a bonus point without applying for a license, tag, or permit by paying the fee established in subsection (5). An applicant not applying for a license, tag, or permit may purchase a bonus point only between July 1 and September 30 in the current license year.
 - (3) The department may only apply any accumulated bonus points to a person's chance to obtain a license, tag, or permit if the person purchases a bonus point when applying for the license, tag, or permit.
 - (4) Bonus points may only be applied to first choice drawings.
 - (5) (a) A resident who does not apply for a license, tag, or permit may purchase a bonus point for \$15 for each species for which a bonus point is made available by the commission.
 - (b) A nonresident who does not apply for a license, tag, or permit may purchase a bonus point for \$25 for each species for which a bonus point is made available by the commission, except that the fee is \$75 for moose, mountain goat, mountain sheep, and wild buffalo or bison.
 - (6) The department may not delete a person's accumulated bonus points unless the person obtains the license, tag, or permit associated with the bonus points, in which case the department shall delete the person's accumulated bonus points.
 - (7) (a) Except as provided in subsection (7)(b), the department shall square the number of points purchased by a person per species when conducting drawings for licenses, tags, and permits.
 - (b) For persons applying for licenses, tags, or permits as a party, the department shall calculate the average number of bonus points accumulated by the individuals listed on the party application, rounded to the nearest whole number, and square the average. Each individual retains their own bonus points unless the party obtains the licenses, tags, or permits associated with the bonus points, in which case the department shall delete each person's accumulated bonus points."

NEW SECTION. Section 6. Codification instruction. [Sections 1 and 2] are intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 87, chapter 2, part 5, and the provisions of Title 87, chapter 2, part 5, apply to [sections 1 and 2].
