<u>Description of fiscal impact:</u> HB 136 does not directly change responsibilities or requirements for state agencies. As a result, this bill has no fiscal impact to the state.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

Judicial Branch

- 1. This bill adopts the Montana Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act; prohibits the abortion of an unborn child capable of feeling pain; and provides definitions, penalties and civil remedies.
- 2. New Section 4 of this bill creates a new felony crime. New Section 5 of the bill creates a new civil cause.
- 3. The number of district court cases may increase as a result of this legislation; however, the Judicial Branch is unable to estimate the impact on judicial workload or the fiscal impact. The cumulative impact of such legislation may eventually require additional judicial resources because the court dockets currently are full in many judicial districts throughout the state.

Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS)

4. There are no new requirements for the DPHHS.

Department of Justice (DOJ)

5. There is no impact on DOJ.

Office of the Public Defender (OPD)

6. The number of court cases assigned to the Office of the Public Defender may increase as a result of this legislation; however, the OPD is unable to estimate future caseload for public defenders. OPD may eventually requires additional resources if caseload demands more public defenders.
