<u>Description of fiscal impact:</u> HB 158 creates a COVID-19 response study commission. The total impact to the general fund is \$226,976 for the 2023 biennium.

## FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **Assumptions:**

## Legislative Branch

- 1. HB 158 creates a COVID-19 response study commission.
- 2. The effective date of HB 158 is July 1, 2021. The termination date of HB 158 is June 30, 2023.
- 3. HB 158 provides for six legislative members who shall be compensated as provided in 5-2-302, MCA.
- 4. HB 158 provides for eight other members who shall be compensated as provided in 2-15-124, MCA.
- 5. HB 158 states that the commission shall meet at least quarterly.
- 6. For the purposes of this fiscal note, it is assumed that there will be eight one-day meetings in Helena in the 2023 biennium.
- 7. Salary for members will be \$8,400 for fiscal year 2022 and \$5,600 in fiscal year 2023.
- 8. Travel for members will be \$21,754 for fiscal year 2022 and \$14,502 for fiscal year 2023.
- 9. HB 158 provides a \$50,000 appropriation. For the commission created in HB 158, the appropriation would be insufficient and will require additional funding.

- 10. Reporting, data collection, and analysis will require 1.00 FTE for the Legislative Services Division. There will be a new employee office package and computer package with a one-time cost of \$1,600 in FY 2022. Salary and benefits for the FTE will be approximately \$87,560 annually.
- 11. Researcher and committee secretary services can also be contracted as a service since this bill has a termination date.
- 12. It is unknown how many bills are seeking to add to the duties of the Legislative Services Division. The fiscal note of each bill is prepared based on the effect of each individual bill. However, when viewed as a package, the cumulative effect of passage of more than one bill would require additional analysis and may require additional resources.
- 13. Due to the cyclical nature of the legislature, the appropriation was split as follows:
  - a. 60% in FY 2022
  - b. 40% in FY 2023
