**Description of fiscal impact:** HB 160 allows for resident service-connected disabled veterans of the armed forces with a minimum of 50% disability rate to receive a wildlife conservation license, a base hunting license, an aquatic invasive species prevention pass, and a Class AAA combination sports license not to include a Class A-6 black bear tag at no cost.

## FISCAL ANALYSIS

## **Assumptions:**

- 1. HB160 moves the language for disabled veterans who meet the qualifying criteria for deer licenses from Restrictions on hunting licenses to Licenses for service members.
- 2. HB 160 eliminates the current half price deer tags for resident disabled veterans who meet the qualifying criteria.
- 3. HB 160 creates a new section that provides a Montana resident, who is a service-connected disabled veteran with a minimum 50% disability rate a new option of four different tags at no cost.

- 4. Statistics received from the US Department of Veterans Affairs states there are 22,195 service-connected disabled veterans that reside in Montana.
- 5. This is estimated at 2.22% of Montana's population.
- 6. In 2020, Fish Wildlife and Parks (FWP) had 149,653 adult hunters.
- 7. Applying the percentage of service-connected disabled veterans that reside in Montana to the number of adult hunters, there are 3,321 service-connected disabled veteran hunters (149,653 hunter's x 2.22%).
- 8. Statistics from Veteransuited.com states 41% have a disability rate of 60% or higher. FWP estimates service-connected disabled veterans with a 50% disability rate or higher is 50%.
- 9. Applying the 50% disability rate to 3,321 resident service-connected disabled veteran hunters estimates there are 1,661 service-connected disabled veteran hunters with a 50% or higher disability rate (50% x 3,321 resident service-connected disabled veteran hunters).
- 10. FWP estimates Montana has 1,661 service-connected disabled veteran hunters with a 50% or higher disability rate.
- 11. The current total cost to purchase the four licenses is \$82.
- 12. The annual total reduction in revenue from the four licenses at no cost would be (\$136,202).
- 13. The license year runs from March 1 to February 28 annually, with a majority of licenses purchased in May and June.
- 14. Because the effective date of the bill is not until March 1, 2022 and not a full year, FY 2022 has a lower estimated reduction in revenue for license sales of (\$102,152).
- 15. The FY 2023, FY 2024, and FY 2025 reduction in revenue is (\$136,202).
