**Description of fiscal impact:** HB 203 would change the threshold for state-level reporting by third-party settlement organizations from \$20,000 to \$600. This would improve income tax compliance and enforcement by increasing the number of 1099-Ks filed with the state. The revenue impact is unknown.

## FISCAL ANALYSIS

## Assumptions:

## **Department of Revenue**

- 1. Under current federal law, third-party settlement organizations do not have to file a 1099-K for payees with transactions totaling less than \$20,000, or if they have less than 200 total transactions.
- 2. HB 203 would require third-party settlement organizations to submit a 1099-K for each payee with a Montana address to the department, and to the payee, if they have transactions totaling more than \$600.
- 3. Some third-party settlement organizations voluntarily file 1099-Ks for payees that are under the minimum threshold, but it is assumed that many do not.
- 4. HB 203 would increase the number of 1099-Ks filed and likely improve tax compliance.
- 5. This bill would likely increase audit revenue as more non-filers would be identified, but does not change tax liability, and the amount of additional revenue that might be collected is unknown.
- 6. This bill is retroactively applicable to tax year 2021.
- 7. The department does not expect to incur significant additional costs as a result of this bill.
