<u>Description of fiscal impact:</u> This bill will create a new ticket for reckless endangerment of emergency personnel and will have a positive fiscal impact on the general fund due to increased fine revenue being received.

### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **Assumptions:**

## Department of Justice

- 1. The Montana Highway Patrol (MHP) averaged 149 citations annually for incidents included in 61-8-346, MCA, over the last five years.
- 2. MHP assumes that 75% of those citations were first offenses and 25% were second or subsequent offenses.
- 3. MHP estimates an increase in revenue of \$12,525 each fiscal year. (149 citations x 75%= 112 citations x \$75 fine increase= \$8,400) (149 citations x 25%= 37 citations x \$450 fine increase= \$16,650) (\$8,400 + \$16,650 = \$25,050/2 = \$12,525)
- 4. Since the bill has an effective date of October 1, 2021, the fiscal impact would be 3/4 in FY 2022.
- 5. Half of the fine revenue received is deposited into the state general fund and half goes to the county in which the citation was written.
- 6. There will be 8 hours of programming changes necessary in MERLIN at an hourly cost of \$120 per hour. The necessary changes include, creating a new ticket for reckless endangerment of emergency personnel, building

new rules for sanctioning based on the new ticket and modifying the interface with the Justice Court Reporting System. The total cost would be \$960.
