FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

Department of Public Health and Human Services

- HB 503 requires an emergency protective services hearing within five business days of a child's removal if requested by the parents, parent, guardian, or other person having physical or legal custody of a child removed from the home. Section 2 allows the parents, parent, guardian, or other person having physical or legal custody of a child who has been removed from the home the opportunity to participate in a conference within 5 days of the child's removal and before a show cause hearing held by the court if the court is participating in a pilot project testing the effectiveness of prehearing conferences. Current law requires DPHHS to file an abuse and neglect petition within the same statutory timeline. The work to prepare for filing the abuse and neglect petition will be used for the emergency protective services hearing, and no additional cost will be incurred.
