**Description of fiscal impact:** HB 565 creates a new misdemeanor of assault on a nurse with a fine of up to \$10,000 and a punishment of up to 6 months in jail. This bill has no fiscal impact to the state. To the extent these assaults constitute events that were not already charged as assault, or if they accrue a higher fine, the additional collections will remain with the jurisdiction of conviction.

### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### Assumptions:

1. It is assumed that charges for assault on a nurse are already brought under existing assault charges. Therefore, there is no fiscal impact to the state.
2. County jails may have additional offenders housed because of HB 565.
3. Local governments may receive additional fine revenue.
