## Office of Public Instruction (OPI)

**Net Impact-General Fund Balance:** 

- 1. The Tribal Computer Programming Boost Scholarship Program created in HB 644 is to support the development of computer programming courses at Indian reservation high schools in the state of Montana and those high school districts who serve members of the Little Shell Chippewa Tribe.
- 2. The OPI would administer the program, develop criteria, and award scholarships to qualifying recipients.
- 3. Scholarships shall be awarded as directed by HB 644 for the purpose of defraying expenses of professional development for high school teachers that create or refine world-class computer programming courses offered at the teacher's high school.

- 4. Scholarship grant awards may be made in amounts up to \$2,000 to districts for the purposes of supporting professional development of high school teachers who take coursework through the Montana University system, a community college, or a tribal college in Montana.
- 5. HB 644 directs that at least two high school teachers on each of the seven Indian reservations in Montana and two high school teachers serving members of the Little Shell Chippewa tribe shall receive these scholarships.
- 6. There is an appropriation of \$32,000 for each year of the 2023 biennium from the state general fund.
- 7. The Office of Public Instruction has determined administration of this program would have minimal costs for the agency, therefore there are no additional costs for administration associated with HB 644.

## Secretary of State

8. This bill will have minimal cost for postage and administrative duties. The Office of the Secretary of State does not receive general fund monies for office operations but has agreed to absorb those costs in its existing operating budget.
