FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

- 1. SB 44 will allow counties to enact a fee to help cover costs associated with local subdivision reviews. If 50% of counties enact this fee, local governments could see a revenue increase of approximately \$65,000 per year.
- 2. The estimated fiscal impact for DEQ would be a decrease in revenue of approximately \$15,000 per year in subdivision fees.
