Description of fiscal impact: SB 139 has no fiscal impact to the state.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

- SB 139 would require that the deputy directors of certain departments be appointed by the Governor. The bill protects current incumbents in deputy director positions, and the appointments would commence when the current incumbent leaves the position.
- Depending on the number of full-time employees in a department, a director could appoint 1 or 2 exempt personal staff.
- As indicated in Section 19 of the bill, exempt staff would be reclassified using existing FTE in an agency and must be paid within existing budgets. Therefore, there is no fiscal impact.
