**Description of fiscal impact:** The fiscal impact to the Montana Lottery from SB 309 is contingent on what the salary of the Lottery Director's salary would be but any fiscal impact is not anticipated to be significant.

### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### Assumptions:

- SB 309 removes statutory language that directed the Montana Lottery's director's salary is equal to 90% of the Department of Administration's director's salary.
- It also removes the language where the salary of the assistant director for security is equal to 90% of the salary of the director of the Montana Lottery.
- SB 309 does not address what the salaries will be. The fiscal impact is cannot be determined, but is not anticipated to be significant.
