<u>Description of fiscal impact:</u> HB 61 eliminates the sunset on the statutory appropriation for the Title X program. This bill has no fiscal impact to the state beyond what is currently included in the Executive budget.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

1. Title X funding is currently authorized and funded via a statutory appropriation. HB 61 proposes to eliminate the sunset date for the Title X statutory appropriation and continue existing services that are currently authorized under present law only through the current biennium. Without passage of the bill or coordinated funding in HB 2, there is no mechanism for the State of Montana to receive and spend Title X funds beyond FY 21.
