

1. The bill amends 87-2-702 3(a), MCA, to include a list of species that once taken (harvested) by the license holder would then prevent that person for their lifetime of being able to draw another tag to harvest that type of animal. A license holder that isn't successful in harvesting one of the animals during the season could continue to apply for licenses in subsequent years until they are successful in harvesting an animal on the list.
2. From the applicant pool for licenses, it is assumed that the loss in revenue from hunters who do harvest an animal and would no longer be able to apply for those licenses will be offset by the revenue generated from sales to new hunters who apply for the special licenses and for bonus points to increase their chance to receive a license.
