Description of fiscal impact: HB 612 provides eligibility for twelfth-grade students who lost an opportunity for postsecondary financial aid as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and authorizes school district trustees to admit or retain a limited number of students for an additional year of academic and athletic eligibility. The increase cost to the state general fund is approximately \$444,000 in the 2023 biennium.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

- 1. HB 612 permits the trustees of a district to admit or retain a pupil who was in their 12th grade academic year in FY 2021 and who was affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 2. Districts defined as first-, second- and third-class districts defined in section 20-6-301, MCA, are limited to additional admitting and/or retaining 5 pupils, 4 pupils, and 3 pupils respectively.
- 3. Adversity effected, is defined as a 12th grade student who lost eligibility for, had an offer rescinded, or likely was denied the opportunity for a scholarship or other financial aid to a post-secondary institution as a result of COVID-19.
- 4. The table below shows the number of districts and the total additional pupils that could be included by school class as related to section 20-6-301, MCA, and HB 612.

- 5. The commissioner of Higher Education reports that approximately, 33% of Montana graduating students attend post-secondary education programs in the MUS system.
- 6. For the purposes of this fiscal note it will be assumed that one half of the 33% will qualify under the proposed language in HB 612, 16% is applied to each "Class" category in determining the number of pupils that will be offered the additional year of education. Consequently, additional pupils will be set as follows: Class 1, 23, Class 2, 51 and Class 3, 26.
- 7. This fiscal note assumes 100 additional enrolled pupils in FY 2022 which has no effect on the FY 2022 school funding costs, but would produce ANB funding in FY 2023 and potentially a slight effect to FY 2024 and FY 2025 due to ANB averaging however, not significant for purposes of this fiscal note.
