**Description of fiscal impact:** SB 259 prohibits the State from interfering with the rights of parents to direct the upbringing, education, healthcare, and mental health of their children. SB 259 does not prohibit the State from performing work related to child abuse and neglect, thus there is no fiscal impact to the Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS).

## FISCAL ANALYSIS

## **Assumptions:**

- 1. New section 1 (2) is explicit that it may not be construed as invalidating the provisions of Title 41, chapter 3 (Child Abuse and Neglect) or modify the burden of proof at any stage of the proceedings under Title 41, chapter 3.
- 2. If a parent prevails in an action against the governmental entity, due to a parent's fundamental rights being violated, the parent is entitled to reasonable attorney fees and costs. The frequency and magnitude of such decisions against the State cannot be reasonably determined.
