<u>Description of fiscal impact</u>: This bill has no impact on the Department of Corrections (DOC) as the Probation and Parole division already informs probationers and parolees about the restoration of their rights under the Montana Constitution at certain stages of serving a criminal sentence.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

- 1. The Probation and Parole Division already notifies persons on supervision of the following:
 - The right to vote is restored after release from a penal institution.
 - Advise they may not run for elected office until final discharge from state supervision.
 - Inform the full rights of citizenship are restored upon termination of state supervision.
 - Informs the probationer or parolee of restoration of rights upon successful completion of the sentence.
- 2. The bill further requires the DOC to document that the notification has occurred.
