26	account in the capital projects fund type provided for in 17-7-209.
27	(5) "LRBP major repair" or "LRBP MR" means the long-range building program major repair
28	account in the capital projects fund type provided for in 17-7-221.

The department of administration is authorized to adjust capital project amounts within the legislative intent of the major repair account-funded projects, subject to available revenues, if approved by the office of budget and program planning, and transfer the appropriations, authority, or both among the necessary fund types for these projects:
