8	Fiscal year 2025 \$4.7 million			
9	(2) The legislature intends that the appropriation be considered part of the ongoing base for the			
10	next legislative session.

12	NEW SECTION. Section 5. Notification to tribal governments. The secretary of state shall send a
