10	BE IT ENACT	ED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
11		
12	NEW	SECTION. Section 1. Mental health school screening program. (1) There is available to
13	schools that wish to participate a mental health school screening program to identify depression, anxiety, and	
14	suicide risk in middle school and high school students.	
15	(2)	The department shall contract with a vendor ONE OR MORE VENDORS that, at a minimum, has
16	HAVE the ability to:	
17	(a)	identify schools interested in providing a mental health screening program that links students to
18	appropriate services, as needed;	
19	(b)	use a best practice, standardized tool to screen for depression, anxiety, and suicide risk;
20	(c)	provide immediate clinical followup services for students whose screenings indicate an
21	imminent risk of self-harm;	
22	(d)	establish a network of mental health professionals who:
23	(i)	commit to being available to provide continued clinical care to students who have an identified
24	need for mental health services if the student or the student's parent elects to seek treatment for the student;	
25	and	
26	(ii)	are able to bill public and private payment sources for the services; and
27	(e)	report regularly to the department on the number of students screened and, in a deidentified



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1	manner, on the outcomes of the screenings, the proportion of students screened who received same-day		
2	mental health services, and the proportion of students who used case management services.		
3	(3) The department shall obtain an acknowledgment from REQUIRE the selected vendor TO PROVID		
4	DOCUMENTATION that the vendor will comply IS COMPLYING with ALL state and federal laws regarding privacy of		
5	student records and health care information, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO:		
6	(A) THE MONTANA PUPIL ONLINE PERSONAL INFORMATION PROTECTION ACT, 20-7-1323 THROUGH 20-7		
7	1326; AND		
8	(B) THE FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT OF 1974, 20 U.S.C. 1232G, AS AMENDED, AND		
9	ITS IMPLEMENTING REGULATIONS AT 34 CFR, PART 99.		
10	(4) A SCHOOL PARTICIPATING IN THE SCREENING PROGRAM SHALL NOTIFY PARENTS OF THE DATE OF ANY		
11	SCREENING AT LEAST A WEEK BEFORE THE SCREENING OCCURS.		
12	(5) The department shall annually report to the legislature, in accordance with 5-11-210, and to the		
13	children, families, health, and human services interim committee on the information received pursuant to		
14	subsection (2)(e).		
15			
16	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Mental health school screening special revenue account report.		
17	(1) There is an account in the state special revenue fund provided for in 17-2-102 to the credit of the		
18	department.		
19	(2) The account consists of:		
20	(a) money transferred from the marijuana state special revenue account as provided in 16-12-111		
21	and		
22	(b) interest or income earned on the account.		
23	(3) Money in the account must be used by the department for the mental health school screening		
24	program provided for in [section 1].		
25			
26	Section 3. Section 16-12-111, MCA, is amended to read:		
27	"16-12-111. Marijuana state special revenue account operating reserve transfer of excess		



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1 funds. (1) There is a dedicated marijuana state special revenue account within the state special revenue fund 2 established in 17-2-102, to be administered by the department. 3 (2) The account consists of: 4 money deposited into the account pursuant to this chapter; (a) 5 the taxes collected pursuant to Title 15, chapter 64, part 1; (b) 6 license and registered cardholder fees deposited into the account pursuant to this chapter: (c) 7 taxes deposited into the account pursuant to 16-12-310; and (d) 8 (e) civil penalties collected under this chapter. 9 (3) Except as provided in subsection (4), money in the account must be used by the department 10 for the purpose of administering the provisions of this chapter. (4) 11 At the end of each fiscal year, the department shall transfer funds in excess of a 3-month 12 operating reserve necessary to fund operating costs at the beginning of the next fiscal year in the following 13 order: 14 (a) an amount not to exceed \$6 million must be transferred to the healing and ending addiction through recovery and treatment (HEART) account established in 16-12-122; 15 16 (b) the net balance remaining after distribution to the HEART account must be distributed as 17 follows: 18 (i) 20% to the credit of the department of fish, wildlife, and parks to be used solely as funding for 19 wildlife habitat in the same manner as funding generated under 87-1-242(3) and used pursuant to 87-1-209; 20 4% to the state park account established in 23-1-105(1); (ii) 21 4% to the trails and recreational facilities account established in 23-2-108; (iii) 22 4% to the nongame wildlife account established in 87-5-121; (iv) 23 the following amounts to the mental health school screening special revenue account provided (v) 24 for in [section 2]: 25 (A) \$2.1 \$1.2 million for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023; and 26 (B) \$4.7 \$2.2 million in each subsequent fiscal year; 27 3% or \$200,000, whichever is less, to the veterans and surviving spouses state special

2	(vi)(vii) for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, \$300,000 to the department of justice to administer		
3	grant funding to local and state law enforcement agencies for the purpose of purchasing and training drug		
4	detection canines and canine handlers, including canines owned by local law enforcement agencies to replace		
5	canines who were trained to detect marijuana;		
6	(vii)(viii) \$150,000 to the board of crime control to fund crisis intervention team training as provided in		
7	44-7-110; and		
8	(viii)(ix) the remainder to the general fund. (Subsection (4)(b)(vi) (4)(b)(vii) terminates June 30, 2025-		
9	sec. 117(2), Ch. 576, L. 2021.)"

11	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Appropriation. (1) The following amounts are appropriated from the		
12	mental health school screening special revenue account provided for in [section 2] to the department of public		
13	health and human services for the purposes of [section 1]:		
14	Fiscal year 2024 \$2.1-\$1.2 million		
15	Fiscal year 2025 \$4.7_\$2.2 million		
16	(2) The legislature intends that the appropriation be considered part of the ongoing base for the		
17	next legislative session.		
18			
19	NEW SECTION. Section 5. Notification to tribal governments. The secretary of state shall send a		
20	copy of [this act] to each federally recognized tribal government in Montana.		
21			
22	NEW SECTION. Section 6. Codification instruction. [Sections 1 and 2] are intended to be codified		
23	as an integral part of Title 53, chapter 21, part 11, and the provisions of Title 53, chapter 21, part 11, apply to		
24	[sections 1 and 2].

26	NEW SECTION. Section 7. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 2023.
