12	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Electrically assisted bicycle. (1) Beginning January 1, 2024, a		
13	manufacturer or distributor of electrically assisted bicycles as defined in 61-8-102 shall apply a label that is		
14	permanently affixed, in a prominent location, to each electrically assisted bicycle. The label must contain the		
15	classification number, top assisted speed, and motor wattage of the electrically assisted bicycle and must be		
16	printed in arial font in at least 9-point font size.		
17	(2) A person may not tamper with or modify an electrically assisted bicycle in order to change the		
18	motor-powered speed capability or engagement of an electrically assisted bicycle unless the label required in		
19	subsection (1) indicating the classification is replaced after modification.		
20	(3) An electrically assisted bicycle must comply with the equipment and manufacturing		
21	requirements of the United States consumer product safety commission as set forth in 16 CFR, part 1512, as of		
22	December 12, 2022.		
23	(4) An electrically assisted bicycle must operate in a manner in which the electric motor is		
24	disengaged or ceases to function when the rider stops pedaling or when the brakes are applied.		
25	(5) (a) Except as provided in subsections (5)(b) and (5)(c)Pursuant to subsection (5)(b), an		
26	electrically assisted bicycle may be ridden, with the motor in operation, in places where bicycles that are solely		
27	human powered are allowed, including but not limited to streets, highways, roadways, bicycle lanes, and bicycle		
28	or shared-use paths.
