12	Section 1. Section 61-8-346, MCA, is amended to read:
13	"61-8-346. Operation of vehicles on approach of authorized emergency vehicles or law
14	enforcement vehicles approaching stationary emergency vehicles or law enforcement vehicles
15	reckless endangerment of emergency personnel. (1) Upon the approach of an authorized emergency
16	vehicle making use of audible and visual signals meeting the requirements of 61-9-402 or of a law enforcement
17	vehicle properly and lawfully making use of an audible signal only, the operator of every other vehicle shall yield
18	the right-of-way and shall immediately drive to a position parallel to, and as close as possible to, the right-hand
19	edge or curb of the roadway clear of any intersection and shall stop and remain in that position until the
20	authorized emergency vehicle or law enforcement vehicle has passed, except when otherwise directed by a
21	police officer or highway patrol officer.
22	(2) This section does not relieve the driver of an authorized emergency vehicle or law enforcement
23	vehicle from the duty to drive with due regard for the safety of all persons using the highway.
24	(3) On approaching and passing a stationary authorized emergency vehicle, law enforcement
25	vehicle, er-tow truck, highway maintenance vehicle, utility service vehicle, or other vehicle that is displaying
26	visible signals of flashing or rotating amber, blue, red, or green lights or any temporary sign advising of an
27	emergency scene or accident ahead, the operator of the approaching vehicle shall:
28	(a) cautiously and in a careful manner reduce the vehicle's speed to a reasonably lower and safe
