16	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Legislative nomination panel. (1) There is a nomination panel made up			
17	of members of the house of representatives for the purposes of providing recommendations to the speaker of			
18	the house about appointments made as provided in 3-1-1101(1)(a). Within 3 days of the start of each regular			
19	legislative session, the speaker of the house shall appoint three representatives to the legislative nomination			
20	panel. The panel must have at least one member from the minority party. If a vacancy occurs on the panel, the			
21	speaker may appoint a replacement.			
22	(2) When a vacancy occurs on the judicial standards commission in a position appointed as			
23	provided in 3-1-1101(1)(a), the speaker of the house shall notify the district court judges, who shall present the			
24	nomination panel with a list of all district court judges who are willing to serve as a commissioner and who have			
25	not been previously censured for violating the Montana code of judicial conduct. After consideration of the			
26	judges' qualifications, the nomination panel shall forward no fewer than three names to the speaker of the			
27	house, who shall select a commissioner from that pool of names.			
28	(3) Members of the nomination panel serve until the start of the first regular session after their
