19	constitutionally	y declared policy of this state to recognize the distinct and unique cultural herita	ge of American
20	Indians and to	be committed in its educational goals to the preservation of their cultural heritage	ge.
21	(2)	It is the intent of the legislature that in accordance with Article X, section 1(2),	of the Montana
22	constitution:		
23	(a)	every Montanan, whether Indian or non-Indian, be encouraged to l earn about	the distinct and
24	unique heritag	e of American Indians in a culturally responsive manner; and	
25	(b)	every educational agency and all educational personnel will work cooperative	ly with Montana
26	tribes or those	tribes that are in close proximity, when providing instruction or when implement	ting an
27	educational go	pal or adopting a rule related to the education of each Montana citizen, to include	e information

7	Section 3. Section 20-1-503, MCA, is amended to read:
8	"20-1-503. Qualification in Indian studies trustees and noncertified personnel Indian
9	education for all. (1) The board of trustees for an elementary or secondary public school district may require
10	that all of its certified personnel satisfy the requirements for instruction in American Indian studies. Pursuant to
11	Article X, section 8, of the Montana constitution, this requirement may be a local school district requirement with
12	enforcement and administration solely the responsibility of the local board of trustees. Pursuant to this part and
13	20-9-329 and the definition of basic system of free quality public elementary and secondary schools under 20-
14	9-309, the board of trustees of a school district shall ensure REQUIRE that all certified personnel and all students
15	receive instruction in American Indian studies.
16	(2) Members of boards of trustees and all noncertified personnel in public school districts are
17	encouraged to satisfy the requirements for instruction in American Indian studies.
18	(3) (A) PURSUANT TO ARTICLE X, SECTION 1(2), OF THE MONTANA CONSTITUTION, 20-1-501, 20-7-101,

3	The Indian education for all payment is calculated as provided in 20-9-306 and is a component			
4	he BASE budget of the district.			
5	(3) The district shall deposit the payment in the general fund of the district.			
6	(4) (a) A public school district that receives an Indian education for all payment may not divert th	е		
7	funds to any purpose other than curriculum development OF AN AMERICAN INDIAN STUDIES PROGRAM, providing			
8	curriculum and materials to students FOR THE PROGRAM, and-providing training to teachers about the PROGRAM'S			
9	urriculum and materials, and preparing and submitting reports as required under subsection (4)(b).			
10	(b) A public school district shall file an annual report with the office of public instruction , in a form			
11	prescribed by the superintendent of public instruction,, IN A FORM AND BY A DATE PRESCRIBED BY THE			
12	SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION, that specifies how the Indian education for all funds were expended IN
