23	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Reporting requirements. (1) Within 30 days of [the effective date of this				
24	act], and every month thereafter, the department of administration and the office of public instruction shall				
25	provide a written report to the committees listed in subsection (3) on the status of the procurement process for				
26	the database modernization project. The report must include information on the potential vendor and the status				
27	of the request for proposal process.				
28	(2) After the procurement process is complete and a vendor has been selected, the office of public				



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1	instruction shall continue to provide written reports to the committees listed in subsection (3) on the status of				
2	the following every 2 months:				
3	(a)	the incurred and anticipated costs of the project;			
4	(b)	the implementation timeline; and			
5	(c)	any other information relevant to the project.			
6	(3)	The department of administration and the office of public instruction shall provide the reports			
7	outlined in subsections (1) and (2) to the following committees:				
8	(a)	the legislative finance committee;			
9	(b)	the education interim committee;			
10	(c)	the general government budget committee provided for in 5-12-501; and			
11	(d)	the education budget committee provided for in 5-12-501.			
12	(4)	The reports must be delivered in an electronic format.
