6	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE BEST BEGINNINGS CHILD CARE
7	SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM; SETTING THE INCOME ELIGIBILITY LEVEL AT 200%-185% OF THE
8	FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL; REQUIRING A MONTHLY COPAYMENT FROM AN ELIGIBLE FAMILY;
9	PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION; AMENDING SECTION 52-2-713, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN
10	EFFECTIVE DATE."
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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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14	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Best beginnings child care scholarship program. There is a best
15	beginnings child care scholarship program administered by the department. The program is established to
16	provide scholarships to qualified low-income families whose child received care provided by a licensed child
17	care provider or day-care facility.
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19	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Family income eligibility requirements. In determining income
20	eligibility for the best beginnings child care scholarship program, the department shall:
21	(1)set a qualifying income threshold at no less than 200% 185% of the federal poverty level for
22	each family size <u>; and</u>
23	(2) set a maximum qualifying income level that is no higher than that allowed by the federal child
24	care and development block grant.
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26	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Copayment requirements. Each eligible family shall participate in the
27	cost of child care by making a copayment. The department shall establish the following copayment amounts:
28	(1) for an eligible family with a qualifying income less than 100% of the federal poverty level, a
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1	copayment of \$10 for each eligible family for each month; and
2	(2) for an eligible family with a qualifying income of 100% of the federal poverty level or more, a
3	copayment based based on a sliding fee scale not to exceed 7% 9% of an eligible family's monthly income.
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5	Section 4. Section 52-2-713, MCA, is amended to read:
6	<b>"52-2-713.</b> Payments for eligible children. The department shall pay a rate established by the
7	department and appropriated by the legislature based on a child's enrollment and set at the child's monthly
8	authorized amount to a day-care facility licensed or registered by the department for each child receiving day-
9	care service and certified eligible by the department to receive day-care services."
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11	NEW SECTION. Section 5. Appropriation. There is appropriated \$10 million from the general fund
12	to the department of public health and human services in each year of the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, for
13	the purposes of [sections 1 through 4].
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15	NEW SECTION. Section 6. Codification instruction. [Sections 1 through 3] are intended to be
16	codified as an integral part of Title 52, chapter 2, part 7, and the provisions of Title 52, chapter 2, part 7, apply
17	to [sections 1 through 3].
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19	NEW SECTION. Section 7. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 2023.
