18	license. The training must be available in each of the transportation commission districts established in 2-15-
19	2502 and must include sufficient classroom and vehicle time so that a student who fulfills the requirements of
20	the training may be issued a commercial driver's license. The department of transportation may adopt rules
21	necessary to implement this section.

23	Section 2. Section 61-5-110, MCA, is amended to read:
24	"61-5-110. Records check of applicants examination of applicants cooperative driver
25	testing programs reciprocal agreement with foreign country. (1) Prior to examining an applicant for a
26	driver's license, the department shall conduct a check of the applicant's driving record by querying the national
27	driver register, established under 49 U.S.C. 30302, and the commercial driver's license information system,
28	established under 49 U.S.C. 31309.
