11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

13	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Child care fund state special revenue account scholarship and		
14	grants. (1) There is a child care state special revenue account to the benefit of the department of public health		
15	and human services. Pursuant to 17-5-703, interest and earnings from the child care trust are transferred into		
16	the state special revenue account monthly.		
17	(2) Eligible uses of the funds in the account include funding programs within the department that		
18	provide scholarships or grants for child care expenses.		
19	(3) Each applicant for a grant or scholarship from the account provided for in this section shall pay		
20	a \$5 fee upon submittal of a request for funds.		
21	(3) Funds in the account are statutorily appropriated pursuant to 17-7-502 to the department of		
22	public health and human services for the purposes set forth in this section.

19 Earnings not transferred to the account established in [section 1] must be retained in the child care fund.

 in 20-9-525 must be retained in the school facilities fund.

Agencies that have entered into agreements authorized by the laws of 11 Montana to pay the state treasurer, for deposit in accordance with 17-2-101 through 17-2-107, as determined 12 by the state treasurer, an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest as due on the bonds or notes have 13 statutory appropriation authority for the payments.
