8 9 10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
11	Section 1. Section 69-1-103, MCA, is amended to read:
12	"69-1-103. Composition of commission. The commission shall consists of five members,
13	who shall be qualified electors of the district from which they are elected:
14	(1) three, with each such member elected from a separate district of the state pursuant to 69-1-104
15	and subject to the term lengths in 69-1-105(2); and
16	(2) two who shall serve as statewide representatives pursuant to 69-1-105(5)."

18	Section 2. Section 69-1-103, MCA, is amended to read:
19	"69-1-103. Composition of commission. The commission shall consists of fivethree
20	members, who shall must be qualified electors of the district from which they are elected, with each such
21	member elected from a separate district of the state."

23	Section 3. Section 69-1-104, MCA, is amended to read:
24	"69-1-104. Public service commission districts. (1) In this state there are fivethree public service
25	commission districts, with one commissioner elected from each district, DISTRICTS ARE BASED ON THE HOUSE
26	DISTRICTS SUBMITTED AS PART OF THE REDISTRICTING PLAN TO THE SECRETARY OF STATE PURSUANT TO ARTICLE V,
27	SECTION 14, OF THE MONTANA CONSTITUTION. THE HOUSE DISTRICTS ARE distributed as follows:

24	(2) The legislature shall evaluate existing commission districts during the legislative session
25	following the receipt of the official final decennial census data and may adjust commission boundaries to
26	comply with the United States constitution DURING A LEGISLATIVE SESSION AND FOLLOWING THE RECEIPT OF THE
27	LATEST OFFICIAL FINAL DECENNIAL CENSUS DATA, THE LEGISLATURE:



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1	<u>(A)</u>	SHALL EVALUATE EXISTING COMMISSION DISTRICTS;
2	<u>(B)</u>	MAY ADJUST COMMISSION BOUNDARIES TO COMPLY WITH THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION;
3	(C)	SHALL PREPARE AND ADOPT A FINAL COMMISSION DISTRICT MAP; AND
4	<u>(D)</u>	SHALL FILE THE FINAL COMMISSION DISTRICT MAP WITH THE SECRETARY OF STATE.
5	(2)	Until December 31, 2026, there may be five serving commissioners:
6	<u>(a)</u>	three serving pursuant to the districts in subsection (1) and subject to the term lengths in 69-1-
7	105(2); and	
8	(c)	two serving as statewide representatives pursuant to 69-1-105(5)."

10	Sectio	n 4. Section 69-1-105, MCA, is amended to read:
11	"69-1-	105. Term of office term limits. (1) A term is for a period of 46 years. A member may not
12	serve more tha	n two terms.
13	(2)	(a) Beginning with the general election of 2024 pursuant to 13-1-104, a district commission
14	member electe	d pursuant to this part shall serve:
15	<u>(i)</u>	an initial 2-year term for the first district;
16	<u>(ii)</u>	an initial 4-year term for the second district; and
17	<u>(iii)</u>	an initial 6-year term for the third district.
18	<u>(b)</u>	All subsequent terms for each district are 6 years.
19	(3)	_A commissioner when elected shall qualify at the time and in the manner provided by law for
20	other state office	cers and shall take office on the first Monday of January after the election.
21	<del>(2)</del> (4)	A commissioner shall serve until a successor is elected and qualified.
22	<del>(3) T</del>	he secretary of state or other authorized official may not certify a candidate's nomination or
23	election to the	public service commission or print or cause to be printed on any ballot the name of a candidate
24	for the public s	ervice commission if, at the end of the current term of that office, the candidate will have served
25	in that office or	, had the candidate not resigned or been recalled, would have served in that office for 8 or more
26	years in a 16-y	ear period.
27	(4) W	/hen computing the time served for the purposes of subsection (3), the provisions of subsection



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1	(3) do not apply to time served in terms that ended during or prior to January 1995.
2	(5) Until December 31, 2026, any member with any portion of a term remaining and not standing
3	for election in the 2024 general election may serve the remainder of that term as a statewide representative."

5	NEW SECTION. Section 5. Effective dates applicability. (1) [Sections 1 and 3 through 6] are
6	effective January 1, 2024, and apply starting with the 2024 general election.
7	(2) [Section 2] is effective January 1, 2026, and applies starting with the 2026 general election.
8	
9	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Effective date. [This act] is effective on passage and approval.
10	
11	NEW SECTION. Section 6. Termination. [Sections 1, 3(3), and 4(5)] terminate December 31, 2026.
