8 9 10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:			
11	Section 1. Section 61-3-225, MCA, is amended to read:			
12	"61-3-225. Motor vehicle wrecking facilitySalvage vehicle transactor quarterly reports			
13	recordkeeping requirements SPECIAL REVENUE ACCOUNT. (1) A motor vehicle wrecking facility, OR SALVAGE			
14	RECYCLING CENTER, OR A PRIVATE INDIVIDUAL ENGAGED IN THE REMOVAL OF VEHICLES FOR COMMERCIAL GAIN (a)			
15	Except as provided in subsection (1)(b), a salvage vehicle transactor shall maintain a vehicle acquisition record			
16	The record must contain:			
17	(a) the time and date of the transaction, and the name of the person conducting the transaction on			
18	behalf of the facility, AND A WRITTEN STATEMENT THAT THE PERSON VERIFIED THE IDENTITY OF THE SELLER OR			
19	TRANSFEROR USING A VALID DRIVER'S LICENSE, PASSPORT, OR STATE IDENTIFICATION CARD;			
20	(b)(i) the year, make, and complete identification number of the vehicle transacted for;			
21	(c)(ii) the amount of consideration given for the vehicle;			
22	(d) a photocopy or scanned copy of a current, valid driver's license, passport, or state identification			
23	card of the seller or transferor. The requirements of this subsection (1)(d) do not apply if the seller or transferor			
24	pays by check or is a professional tow truck operator OR AUTO SALVAGE AUCTION.			
25	(iii) a notarized log of the transaction between the two parties containing sufficient information to			
26	identify both parties;			
27	(e)(D)(iv) a signature of the seller or transferor; and			



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1	(f)(E)(v) the certificate of title if it is obtainable.			
2	(b) This subsection (1) does not apply to a motor vehicle wrecking facility maintaining records			
3	required by 75-10-512. The department of justice, the department of environmental quality, or a local law			
4	enforcement agency with competent jurisdiction may inspect and copy the records kept pursuant to 75-10-512.			
5	(2) Quarterly, the owner or operator of a motor vehicle wrecking facility, as defined in 75-10-501,			
6	shall deliver to the department or an authorized agent, on a form approved by the department, a list of all junk			
7	vehicles, as defined in 75-10-501, received by the owner or operator of the motor vehicle wrecking facility			
8	during the quarter, stating the year, make, and complete identification number of each vehicle. If the owner or			
9	operator of a motor vehicle wrecking facility received a certificate of title when the owner or operator of the			
10	facility received a junk vehicle on the list, that certificate of title must accompany the list a copy of the vehicle			
11	acquisition record REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (1).			
12	(3)(2) The For vehicles obtained by a motor vehicle wrecking facility OR SALVAGE RECYCLING CENTERS			
13	salvage vehicle transactor that may be rebuilt, the department shall issue a receipt for the certificate of title if			
14	requested by the owner or operator of the facility, and the receipt may serve as an instrument for reclaiming the			
15	certificate of title if the vehicle is rebuilt.			
16	(4)(3) (A) The record required by subsection (1) may, upon request, be inspected and copied by the			
17	department of justice, the department of environmental quality, or a local law enforcement agency with			
18	competent jurisdiction. A MOTOR VEHICLE WRECKING FACILITY salvage vehicle transactor THAT FAILS TO PROVIDE			
19	the record on a request for inspection and copying TO THE DEPARTMENT A VEHICLE ACQUISITION RECORD THAT			
20	COMPLIES WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (1) IS SUBJECT TO PENALTIES PURSUANT TO TITLE 30, CHAPTER			
21	14, PART 1.			
22	(B) PENALTIES COLLECTED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION (4) (3) BY THE DEPARTMENT of justice ARE NOT			
23	SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF 30-14-143 OR 30-14-226 AND MUST BE DEPOSITED INTO A STATE SPECIAL REVENUE			
24	ACCOUNT PROVIDED FOR IN SUBSECTION (4)(C) (3)(C).			
25	(C) THERE IS AN ACCOUNT IN THE STATE SPECIAL REVENUE FUND TO THE CREDIT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF			
26	JUSTICE TO DEFRAY THE COST TO THE DEPARTMENT IN INVESTIGATING AND ENFORCING THIS SECTION.

8	Section 2. Section 75-10-512, MCA, is amended to read:			
9	"75-10-5	512. Records required of facilities. (1) Each motor vehicle wrecking facility shall maintain		
10	books or files in	which are kept a record and description of every junk vehicle obtained by it, together with the		
11	name and address of the person from whom the vehicle was purchased.			
12	(2)	This record must also contain:		
13	(a)	the certificate of title, sheriff's certificate of sale, notarized bill of sale from the former owner or		
14	person selling the vehicle, release of ownership or interest in the motor vehicle, or sheriff's release;			
15	(b)	the name of the state where the vehicle was last registered;		
16	(c)	the make of the vehicle;		
17	(d)	the vehicle identification number, as defined in 61-3-210, or the motor number, identification		
18	number, or serial number;			
19	(e)	the date purchased;		
20	(f)	the disposition of the vehicle.		
21	(3)	An authorized representative of the department of justice, the department of environmental		
22	quality, or a loca	al law enforcement agency of competent jurisdiction who presents credentials may also inspect,		
23	have access to,	and copy records required under this section."
