6 (b) A person registered as an addiction counselor licensure candidate shall register annually until 7 the person becomes a licensed addiction counselor. The board may limit the number of years that a person 8 may act as an addiction counselor licensure candidate.

9 (c) A student is not required to register as an addiction counselor licensure candidate.

10 (6) (a) As a prerequisite to the issuance of a license and registration as an addiction counselor

11 licensure candidate, the board shall require an applicant to submit fingerprints for the purpose of fingerprint

12 checks by the Montana department of justice and the federal bureau of investigation as provided in 37-1-307.

13 The board may require a criminal background check of applicants and determine the suitability for licensure as

14 provided in 37-1-201 through 37-1-205 and 37-1-307.

(b) If an applicant has a history of criminal convictions, then pursuant to 37-1-203, the applicant
has the opportunity to demonstrate to the board that the applicant is sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the
public trust and if the board determines that the applicant is not, the license may be denied.

18 (7) A person holding a license to practice as a licensed addiction counselor in this state may use
19 the title "licensed addiction counselor".

20 (8) Individuals enrolled in a certificate program not connected to a degree program prior to January

21 31, 2023, must obtain the certificate prior to June 30, 2025, to be eligible for licensure and must meet all other

22 requirements for licensure in effect prior to [the effective date of this act]."

If both House Bill No. 137 and 25 [this act] are passed and approved and if House Bill No. 137 repeals 37-35-202, then [section 1 of this act], 26 amending 37-35-202, terminates September 30, 2023, and [section 12 of House Bill No. 137] must be amended 27 as follows:
