	14	(2) The rules must contain provisions that allow for a fire to be left unattended when the risk of							
	15	spreading is highly unlikely, including but not limited to:							
	16	(a) the presence of snow, other moisture, or forecasted moisture;							
	17	(b) no high wind warnings in the immediate forecast; and							
	18	(c) at least one site visit to ensure the risk is minimized.							
	19	(2) Immediate or continuous presence is not required for slash burning conducted under this

	21	(a) significant precipitation, the presence of persistent snow cover, fuel moisture conditions, or a							
	22	combination of those factors sufficiently inhibit the chance of fire spreading under current and foreseeable
