12	sell beer or table wine, or both, in the original packages for off-premise	es consumption may be issued only to a
13	person, firm, or corporation that is approved by the department as a person, firm, or corporation qualified to sell	
14	beer or table wine, or both. If the premises proposed for licensing are operated in conjunction with another	
15	business, that business must be a grocery store or drugstore licensed	as a pharmacy. The number of licenses
16	that the department may issue is not limited by the provisions of 16-4-105 but must be determined by the	
17	department in the exercise of its sound discretion, and the department may in the exercise of its sound	
18	discretion grant or deny an application for any license or suspend or re	evoke any license for cause.
19	(2) Upon On receipt of a completed application for a licer	se under this section, accompanied by
20	the necessary license fee as provided in 16-4-501, the department sh	all request that the department of justice
21	make a background investigation of all matters relating to the application.

2 (5) A license issued under this section may offer curbside pickup between 8 a.m. and 2 a.m. in 3 original packaging.

(6) A grocery store with a license to sell beer and TABLE wine in original packaging may apply to the department and pay a fee for an endorsement to, with the licensee's own agents or employees who are 21 years of age or older, deliver beer and TABLE wine in original packaging if the delivery includes groceries in their original packaging or food that is prepared by the licensee at the licensee's premises. The purchase price of the delivered beer and TABLE wine may not exceed the purchase price of the delivered food. Deliveries under this subsection may be made only to a residential or commercial address."
