15	WHEREAS, Montana state and local policymakers are often forced to make critical decisions about the				
16	safety of their communities and constituents using limited or stale criminal justice data; and				
17	WHEREAS, the Montana Legislature wants to work in conjunction with state and local partners to				
18	improve data collection, including the specific consensus-driven metrics proposed in the Justice Counts				
19	initiative; and

21	Montana policymakers change the current reactionary nature of our criminal justice system to achieve better				
22	results by enabling more analysis; and
