5	MONTANA PROVIDING RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE LEGISLATIVE REDISTRICTING PLAN TO THE				
6	MONTANA DISTRICTING AND APPORTIONMENT COMMISSION.

8	WHEREAS, the Montana Districting and Apportionment Commission submitted its legislative				
9	redistricting plan to the Legislature on January 6, 2023, as required by Article V, section 14, of the Montana				
10	Constitution; and				
11	WHEREAS, the Montana Constitution requires the Commission to submit a proposed plan to the				
12	Legislature for recommendations to alter the proposal; and				
13	WHEREAS, the Montana Constitution mandates that districts must be as equal in population as is				
14	practicable and be compact and contiguous; and				
15	WHEREAS, the Commission established a maximum average standard deviation of plus or minus 1%,				
16	which surpasses the standards of the 2013 Commission, which maintained a standard deviation of 3%; and				
17	WHEREAS, the Commission formed districts that successfully comply with all requirements of the				
18	federal Voting Rights Act and that protect the voting rights of minority populations; and				
19	WHEREAS, the Legi	slature finds that the Commission's tentative map does	s not meet Montana's state		
20	constitutional mandate of cor	npactness in urban areas in Missoula County, Lewis a	nd Clark County, and		
21	Gallatin County; and				
22	WHEREAS, the Legi	slature finds that the Commission's tentative map does	s follow its own criterion for		
23	functional compactness in se	veral areas around the state; and			
24	WHEREAS, the Legislature finds the Commission did not follow its criterion to minimize the splitting of				
25	municipalities whenever possible, such as the city of Whitefish; and				
26	WHEREAS, the Legi	slature finds the Commission did not follow its criterion	to consider		
27	competitiveness of proposed	districts <u>in Belgrade</u> ; and			
28	WHEREAS, the Legi	slature finds the Commission did not follow its mandate	ory criterion for keeping		



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1	communities of interest whole;	and			
2	WHEREAS, the Legislature finds the Commission did not apply its criterion consistently when drawing				
3	legislative districts; and				
4	WHEREAS, the Legislature finds the Commission did not follow its criterion to keep communities of				
5	interest intact when pairing House districts into Senate districts, including in Flathead County and districts in				
6	Granite, Powell, Lewis and Clark, and Jefferson Counties.

8	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF				
9	THE STATE OF MONTANA:				
10	That the Legislature exercises its constitutional role of recommendation to urge the passage of				
11	amendments necessary for the Legislative Redistricting Plan to conform to the Commission's established				
12	criteria. To this end, the Legislature recommends that the Commission consider the following amendments:				
13	(1) redraw as nece	essary to keep cities intact;			
14	(2) redraw noncor	npact districts while also following the Commission's o	criterion of looking at district		
15	competitiveness; and				
16	(3) redraw the Bel	grade area to ensure a competitive seat within Belgra	de city limits; and		
17	(<mark>3)(4)</mark> keep establish	ed communities of interest intact by reconfiguring Hou	ise pairings to Senate		
18	seats.
