<u>Description of fiscal impact:</u> This legislation makes the Interim Budget Committees, previously established in the 67th Legislative Session as part of HB 497, permanent. Current law (5-12-501, MCA) provides for the committees to operate through December 31, 2025, so there is no fiscal impact for fiscal years 2024 and 2025. The total cost to the state is \$47,197 in fiscal year 2026 and \$47,905 in fiscal year 2027.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

Legislative Branch

- 1. 5-12-501, MCA lists six Interim Budget Committees:
 - o Section A General Government (seven legislative members)
 - o Section B Health and Human Services (seven legislative members)
 - o Section C Natural Resources and Transportation (eight legislative members)
 - o Section D Judicial, Law Enforcement, Corrections (seven legislative members)
 - o Section E Education (eight legislative members)
 - o Section F Long Range Planning (six legislative members)

- 2. HB110 removes the termination date in 5-12-501, MCA, and makes the committees permanent. Current law provides for Interim Budget Committees to operate through December 31, 2025, so HB 110 does not impact the 2025 biennium.
- 3. Under current law, when the Interim Budget Committees sunset, operational and legislator costs will decrease.
- 4. The proposed legislation will require the Legislative Fiscal Division to provide the support staff for the committees. For the purposes of this fiscal note, it is assumed that the pooled secretary positions requested in HB 2 are adopted and staffing will be available within existing budget.
- 5. Each Interim Budget Committee will have four one-day meetings in Helena in each even-numbered calendar year and two one-day meetings in Helena in each odd-numbered calendar year. This leaves two meetings in fiscal year 2026 and two meetings in fiscal year 2027 that require funding.
- 6. For the purposes of this fiscal note, current travel and salary rates were used and inflated by 1.5%.
