### FISCAL ANALYSIS

**Assumptions:**

1. HB 120, as amended, allows the Department of Revenue to allow alcoholic beverage industry trade shows or partner with other state agencies to allow alcoholic beverage industry trade shows.
2. This bill allows the Department of Revenue to adopt rules to clarify how these trade shows would occur.
3. This bill allows the Department of Revenue to recoup administrative costs.
4. The Department of Revenue estimates that administrative costs from allowing these trade shows would be minimal; therefore, this bill would have no fiscal impact.
