Description of fiscal impact: HB 175 has no fiscal impact to the state.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

- 1. HB 632, passed by the 2021 Legislature, provided appropriations of funds received by the state from the federal government through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).
- 2. HB 632 grouped ARPA funds into four main categories and created four advisory commissions made up of representatives from the House, Senate, and Executive Branch.
- 3. These commissions met numerous times during the interim, to receive information regarding proposed uses of the ARPA funds. The commissions then made recommendations to the Governor, who then made final determinations on the uses of these funds.
- 4. HB 175 allows for the transfer of funds between the commissions to allow the Executive to implement final recommendations of the commissions (contingent on passage and approval of this bill). There is no fiscal impact.
