<u>Description of fiscal impact:</u> HB 377 establishes the Montana 250th Commission and allocates administrative responsibility of the commission to the Montana Historical Society (MTHS) and appropriates \$177,557 to MTHS for the 2025 biennium.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

Net Impact-General Fund Balance:

- 1. HB 377 establishes a Montana 250th Commission leading up to the United States semiquincentennial to promote civic engagement and increase public awareness of United States and Montana government and history, including tribal nations history.
- 2. The commission will consist of eleven members and defines each member's representation.
- 3. The commission is expected to seek gifts, donations, grants, and other sources of funding to support its activities, as stipulated in Section 4. However, because these amounts are unable to be determined, there is not an estimate of revenue included in this fiscal note. Any funds raised would supplement the funds provided in this bill.
- 4. Commission members will not receive compensation but are entitled to travel expenses reimbursement per Section 1(5). It is assumed that the commission will be chosen early in FY 2024 and will meet twice a year in-person and twice a year virtually in FY 2024, FY 2025, and FY 2026. In FY 2027, the commission will meet one time in-person and one time virtually.

- 5. The MTHS will need a part-time administrative assistant, 0.50 FTE, to support the commission. Salary, and benefits costs will be \$40,771 for FY 2024 and FY 2025 increasing by 1.5% in FY 2026 and FY 2027. The FTE would only work six months in FY 2027.
- 6. In FY 2024, operating expenses also include one-time costs of \$2,800 for an office package and a computer package for the 0.50 FTE administrative assistant.
- 7. HB 377 appropriates \$177,557 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023 (FY 2024). MTHS will have expenses to December 31, 2026 and has no appropriation authority for FY 2026 or FY 2027.

Technical Notes:

1. The MTHS will have continued costs to prepare for the Montana 250th Commission from FY 2024 through FY 2026 and until December 31, 2026 (FY 2027). The appropriation in this bill is sufficient to cover the costs through FY 2027 but is authorized for the 2025 biennium only. Authority for this funding needs to continue into the biennium beginning July 1, 2025.
