## **Board of Public Education (board)**

**Net Impact-General Fund Balance:** 

- 1. HB 394 directs the Board of Public Education (board) to explore the creation of state-tribal education accords to establish state-tribal education accord schools as described in this bill. The purpose of the exploration is described in the Section 1 of the bill.
- 2. Governing bodies of federally recognized tribes in the state must initiate the exploration by submitting a resolution to the board by September 30, 2023. The resolution is to identify tribal organizations that will participate. If no resolution is received by that date, the board is under no obligation to continue the exploration.
- 3. If a resolution is submitted to the board, the board must initiate meetings no later than December 1, 2023.
- 4. No later than September 1, 2024, the board is to report recommendations to the Education Interim Committee and to the State-Tribal Relations Committee related to the collaborative exploration.

- 5. For purposes of the fiscal note, the board anticipates two to three tribes will apply to participate in the exploration of state-tribal education accords.
- 6. Board staff will travel to various locations around the state to meet with tribal leaders as well as in-person meetings. It is anticipated that one staff member will travel at least ten times throughout the year. Motor pool, lodging, and meal costs will total approximately \$2,500.
- 7. The board may need to hire a contractor to facilitate the requirements in HB 394. It is estimated the cost would be \$5,000.
